Events & Activities

HIGHLIGHTS

A vibrant cultural calendar defines community life at Alliance Française de Sydney. Members, students, and visitors are invited to engage in a rich program of activities, including presentations, round table discussions, soirées, workshops, conferences, and more. Over 300 guests per month attend these cultural events, contributing to the lively atmosphere at the Alliance Française de Sydney Centre.

In 2023, the "Philo Bistro" series, hosted by Olivier Vojetta, continued its solid growth with several sold-out events. At these gatherings, Olivier and a guest — such as a writer, artist, or musician — engaged in debates with the public on a variety of themes. We had the pleasure of hosting Philippe Besson, Camille Laurens, Sophie Beaumont, and many others throughout the year.

Highlights of the year included the celebration of the 140th anniversary of the creation of the Alliances Françaises, a talk on the Rugby World Cup with Peter FitzSimons and Nick Farr-Jones, a discussion with Penelope Seidler on architecture, and at the café, the Beaujolais Nouveau party.

2023 also saw the organisation of our Bastille Day party. Themed "France: North and South," over 900 people gathered at the Argyle to celebrate Bastille Day in style. Martin Juillard, Consul General of France in Sydney, opened the event. Australian musician Emma Hamilton kicked off the festivities with French songs on piano and accordion, followed by a set of French music by DJ Loo-e, accompanied by performances by Can-Can dancers. The evening, which concluded in the early hours of the morning, was a great making our Bastille success, traditional event the highlight of our winter calendar.

A commemorative event was hosted with Kambala school to honour the founder of the Alliance Française de Sydney, Augustine Soubeiran. The 13th floor has now been named after her in recognition of her pedagogy and dedication.



ALLIANCE FRANÇAISE FRENCH FILM FESTIVAL

The Alliance Française French Film Festival has resumed its growth following a challenging 2022, which was marked by adverse weather and pandemic fears.

With 51,141 admissions in Sydney and over 176,000 nationally, the festival has surpassed expectations in the film market. The line-up was curated with passion and talent by Karine Mauris, Artistic Director of the festival and Cultural Attaché at the French Embassy. It featured 39 films — a blend of French blockbusters and more challenging films that left a lasting impression on our audience.

We were delighted to have Kambala School Deputy Principal Joanne Sarmiento join us. Kambala is one of the oldest institutions in Sydney, and Joanne's visit highlighted the strong bond between our two schools and countries.

During the evening, we took a moment to reflect on the legacy of one of our remarkable founders, Augustine Soubeiran. She was the President of the Alliance Française de Sydney in 1910, a co-principal at Kambala School in Rose Bay, and served as the Secretary of the French-Australian League of Help during World War I, providing vital support to French troops and civilians. Her legacy continues to inspire our organisation.

Our multi-purpose hall has officially been renamed "Salle Augustine Soubeiran" in her honour and in memory of her work for education, the teaching of French and contribution to peace.
